Imagining Our New Chapel

I've been somewhat surprised that in the last few years there has been an uptick in public discourse around pregnancy and infant loss. I've seen my friends on social media be honest about their loss, and virtual support groups have been created to ensure accessibility for all families. Even the Duchess of Sussex wrote an op-ed for the *New York Times* in November 2020! Yet for each story that a family shares, there are so many more who are not ready. I've wondered how The Tree of Life Chapel will bless those people.

I imagine someone, perhaps a woman like myself, walking into the garden to see the names of other children on the stones in front of the fountain; a reminder that she is not alone. I imagine a family opening up the resource box to find pamphlets on grief groups in the community, perhaps even written stories and prayers from others who grieved in this space. I wonder how this ministry of sacred space will deepen a sense of community for a grief that can be so isolating. It is my prayer that this may be so.

When you imagine this space we're providing, I wonder what the Holy Spirit puts upon your mind. How do you see us blessing our community with this Chapel? I'd love to hear your thoughts, and I'd love for you to join us as we mark this new ministry together:

- On October 9th, we'll have a wine/cheese fundraiser located near our outdoor chapel, an event which I hope will attract folks from outside our church community;
- On October 10th, we'll focus on this chapel in our worship service together; and
- On October 15th, we will gather around our soonto-be chapel for a Service of Remembrance.

One of the holiest witnesses we have as Christians is to stand with those who are suffering. Indeed, in our solidarity we are providing a powerful message of resurrection. A love so powerful that it can withstand grief. A Love so strong that it reached beyond the grave and points us to new life.

All classes begin at 11:00 am and will take place in the sanctuary. The class will also be available on Zoom.






love story, the novel explores what it means to be changed by the grace of animals.
