Passion Sunday

This week, the center of the church's year, is one of striking contrasts: Jesus rides into Jerusalem surrounded by shouts of glory, only to be left alone to die on the cross, abandoned by even his closest friends. Mark's gospel presents Jesus in his complete human vulnerability: agitated, grieved, scared, forsaken. Though we lament Christ's suffering and all human suffering, we also expect God's salvation: in the wine and bread, Jesus promises that his death will mark a new covenant with all people. We enter this holy week thirsty for the completion of God's astonishing work.

All who hunger for the love of God are welcome to receive Holy Communion. You are invited to come forward, take an empty cup or a cup filled with grape juice, and kneel at the rail (as you are able). The Pastor will place a wafer in your hand and the Vicar will fill your cup with wine. As you return to your seat, please put the empty cup in the basket. If you are not comfortable coming to the altar and prefer to receive communion at your seat, please pick up a communion kit on your way in to the sanctuary. Gluten free wafers are also available.

Jesus enters Jerusalem

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, [Jesus] sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.' "They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

"Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

And you have blessed we who carry them.



Started decades ago to get homeless preschool children at the Cherry Tree Club excited about fresh veggies and later expanded to the property next door when the church realized how many were going hungry, the Peace Garden grows fresh produce to Fight Food Insecurity. Many people, even if working, are barely making ends meet so buying the cheapest processed foods may seem their only option. Those in low income neighborhoods often can't get fresh vegetables without a car to get to bigger grocery stores with better (though still too high) prices.

Food Pantries are part of the solution Freshly harvested produce is treasured by these families trying to stay healthy! Each year close to 1,000 pounds of vegetables are donated from this garden to local food pantries, mostly through St. Bartholomew Lutheran Church in Trenton. YOU CAN HELP! NO EXPERIENCE NECESSARY!!!
